SUBJECT: FY2027 Congressionally Directed Spending Application- Lake Fort Smith Water Transmission Line, Section 2A1-2

SUMMARY

The Office of United States Senator John Boozman has recently announced that the Senator is accepting Congressionally Directed Spending requests to be considered for inclusion within the FY2027 federal budget. After evaluating the feasibility of several projects, it has been determined that requesting funds to complete section 2A1-2 of the Lake Fort Smith Water Transmission Line would be of great benefit to the city's water utility, would constitute a compelling funding need, and is eligible for funding through guidelines promulgated by the Senate Appropriations Committee.

Director of Engineering Todd Mittge, based on consultation with City Administration, and feedback from the Board of Directors, contends that the replacement of the water transmission line is a priority for his department and the city. The City of Fort Smith previously received Congressionally Directed Spending funds from the Office of United States Senator John Boozman in FY2024 for section 2A1-1 of the transmission line.

Included on the agenda for the March 31, 2026 special meeting is a resolution authorizing the City Administrator to submit an FY2027 Community Project Funding request for up to \$12,000,000 from the Office of United States Senator John Boozman for section 2A1-2 of the Lake Fort Smith Water Transmission Line. The resolution also acknowledges that such program may require up to 25% local matching funds if awarded.

Senator Boozman's office only recently published the notice that it is accepting Congressionally Directed Spending requests for FY2027. Requests for funding must be submitted to the Senator's office by Sunday, April 5, 2026.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO SUBMIT AN FY2027 CONGRESSIONALLY DIRECTED SPENDING REQUEST TO THE OFFICE OF UNITED STATES SENATOR JOHN BOOZMAN FOR COMPLETION OF PHASE 2A1-2 OF THE LAKE FORT SMITH WATER TRANSMISSION LINE

WHEREAS, The Fort Smith Board of Directors recognizes that the Office of United States Senator John Boozman is accepting requests for Congressionally Directed Spending Funds for FY2027; and

WHEREAS, Replacement of the water transmission line is within the engineering Capital Improvement plan and is already in the process of being replaced; and

WHEREAS, The City of Fort Smith has previously received Congressionally Directed Spending funds within the federal FY2024 appropriations cycle in the amount of \$12,000,000 for section 2A1-1 of the Lake Fort Smith Water Transmission Line; and

WHEREAS, Replacement of the water transmission line will increase transmission capacity, system reliability, and reduce maintenance costs; and

WHEREAS, The Fort Smith Board of Directors understands that a match in the amount of up to 25% may be required with respect to the FY2027 Congressionally Directed Spending request; and

WHEREAS, Matching funds will be paid from Fund 2101, Water and Sewer Operating Fund; and

WHEREAS, The Fort Smith Board of Directors understands that a submittal does not guarantee that such request will be selected or make it through the federal appropriations process.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY OF FORT SMITH, ARKANSAS THAT:

Section 1: The City Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to submit a FY2027 Congressionally Directed Spending request for up to \$13,000,000 to the Office of United States Senator John Boozman for work on phase 2A1-2 of the Lake Fort Smith Water Transmission Line.

Section 2: While there is no guarantee that the request authorized by Section 1 will be funded, the Board of Directors recognizes that if selected for funding, a local match of as much as 25% may be required.

SUBJECT: FY2027 Congressionally Directed Spending Application-Rogers Avenue Utility Relocation

SUMMARY

The Office of United States Senator John Boozman has recently announced that the Senator is accepting Congressionally Directed Spending requests to be considered for inclusion within the FY2027 federal budget. After evaluating the feasibility of several projects, it has been determined that requesting funds for the relocation of utilities along Rogers Avenue would constitute a compelling funding need and is eligible for funding through guidelines promulgated by the Senate Appropriations Committee.

The Arkansas Department of Transportation (ARDOT) is planning a significant construction project along Arkansas State Highway 22 (Rogers Avenue) in the coming years. The project will widen and improve the corridor from Waldron Avenue, beneath the Interstate, to 74th Street, with the goal of enhancing traffic flow and increasing public safety. In preparation for construction, the City will be required to acquire necessary easements and relocate municipal water and sewer utilities currently located within the state right-of-way.

Included on the agenda for the March 31, 2026, special meeting is a resolution authorizing the City Administrator to submit an FY2027 Community Project Funding request for up to \$20,000,000 from the Office of United States Senator John Boozman for utility relocation along Rogers Avenue. The resolution also acknowledges that such program may require up to 25% local matching funds if awarded.

Senator Boozman's office only recently published the notice that it is accepting Congressionally Directed Spending requests for FY2027. Requests for funding must be submitted to the Senator's office by Sunday, April 5, 2026.

SUBJECT: Consolidated NG911 PSAP Project Update

SUMMARY

The Arkansas legislature passed the Arkansas Public Safety Communications and Next Generation 911 Act of 2019, which established the legal framework for consolidating public safety answering points (PSAPs) across the state. The Act authorized multijurisdictional PSAPs through written mutual aid agreements approved by the Arkansas 911 Board, and requires that any such agreement include a fair-share funding contribution from all participating political subdivisions.

Acting under this authority, the City of Fort Smith (Resolution R-213-24) and Sebastian County entered into a Mutual Aid/Interlocal Agreement effective December 3, 2024, to consolidate their respective E911 PSAPs into a single entity — the River Valley Communications Center (RVCC). The Agreement was duly approved and authorized by the Arkansas Attorney General. The Agreement established a 911 Governing Board responsible for budget oversight, with approved expenditures forwarded to both the Sebastian County Quorum Court and the City of Fort Smith Board of Directors for final approval. Currently, the City operates its PSAP through the Fort Smith Police Department, and the County operates its PSAP through the Sheriff's Department.

Following its formation, the RVCC Governing Board evaluated three available facility locations suitable for consolidating dispatch operations. In January, 2025, the Governing Board selected 4501 Burrough Road as the designated consolidation site and began construction plans. Next, the RVCC Governing Board selected me as the Executive Director to oversee the consolidation of the two PSAPs into the unified River Valley Communications Center 911 PSAP. Due to funding concerns, the construction of the new facility at 4501 Burrough Road was stopped in late 2025 to research and seek out alternative funding plans and locations. Additionally, the 2026 operating budget of RVCC was funded solely through the use of the accrued 911 fund balance to allow for the transition to a fully consolidated center with an improved cost estimation for the 2027 budget cycle.

To satisfy the legislative requirements, full consolidation is planned to occur the week of July 6, 2026, following the approval of a six-month extension by the Arkansas 911 Board. Without a planned facility, the consolidation will be temporarily located in the Fort Smith PSAP within the

Police Department. All Fort Smith and Sebastian County dispatchers will operate within this location after this date. Upon consolidation, the primary and most urgent need is to replace the aging radio equipment within the dispatch center. Per a recent announcement from the Arkansas Wireless Information Network (AWIN), that equipment will no longer be operational after 2031. Finally, while the July 2026 consolidation will initially be housed within the Police Department, that arrangement is not a permanent solution. Additional space is needed to facilitate the full breadth of needs related to complete 911 communications consolidation, namely the addition and implementation of emergency medical dispatch. A standalone facility is essential not only to the long-term performance and interoperational integrity among police, fire, EMS, and OEM agencies within Sebastian County, but also to the professional identity of the consolidated communications center that could potentially grow into a larger, regional Emergency Communications Center if these needs are met.

I am thankful for this opportunity to provide this update on our consolidation and the needs of the RVCC to the Board of Directors at the March 31, 2026 study session, and look forward to answering questions from the Board regarding the status of this consolidation effort.

SUBJECT: Crain Precinct and Training Facility

SUMMARY

The establishment of a second police precinct in the southeastern portion of Fort Smith has long been an identified public safety need for adequately addressing the expected population growth and geographical expansion of our city. Secondary to that is the desire to implement a dedicated public safety training facility capable of supporting and hosting quality training to the entire region while removing our current operation from the limited space we utilize at the Sebastian County Emergency Management Center for that purpose. The need for these projects to strategically prepare for the rapidly changing public safety landscape in Fort Smith has been presented annually, in a variety of reports and funding requests, for the last 8-10 years. These include Future Fort Smith goals and objectives and police department Capital Improvement Plans. Prior to my tenure as the chief of police, locations were actively being sought with plans to have these projects completed within ten (10) years. We are at or near that ten year goal.

At the request of the former City Administrator, the Board of Directors voted unanimously on March 26th, 2024 to purchase property located at 8200 Highway 71 South to be used, in part, as both a second police precinct and a dedicated training facility. The property consists of three (3) existing structures sitting on approximately 4.4 acres of real estate. While not our first choice, the property is ideally situated for a police precinct and large enough to accommodate a regional training facility. At the time the purchase was being considered, the police department was only interested in two (2) existing structures which consisted of the former main showroom and an attached service center. The previous City Administrator intended to utilize the third structure, an auto body repair shop, as a centralized vehicle maintenance facility for all departments. All purchase negotiation and identification of funding was done by the previous City Administrator with the police department ultimately contributing \$1,000,000 of then budgeted funds to the purchase of the property. At the direction of Administration, the police department utilized MAHG Architecture Inc. to begin drafting plans for the precinct and training facility. We currently have three (3) conceptual designs of varying size and expense to consider.

Funding to begin construction has been requested each year since the property was purchased and each year, has been eliminated at some stage from the police department's budget. There has been some public discussion and concern about the need to continue with


this project as well as mixed opinions from current Board members. The police department needs clear guidance on how to proceed.


I am respectfully requesting an opportunity to fully present this project to the Board of Directors at a Study Session disclosing: current and expected public safety needs, why this particular location was chosen, the amount of funds already expended, profit/loss realities should the city choose to sell the property, architectural options, actions taken to identify alternative funding sources, and a proposal for completing this project in the next three (3) to five (5) years. In addition to myself and closely involved police department staff, representatives from MAHG will be on hand to answer questions.

Calls for Police Services to Beat 16




