3. Agreement to match on a dollar-for-dollar basis the LHTF Award pursuant to Guidelines Section 104. Applicant hereby agrees to utilize matching funds on a dollar-for-dollar basis for the same Eligible Project for which Program Funds are used, as required by HSC Section 50843.5(c);
4. Pursuant to Exhibit A of the Resolution, the LHTF funds will be expended only for Eligible Projects and consistent with all program requirements.
5. Applicant shall be subject to the terms and conditions as specified in the Standard Agreement, H&S Section 50842.2 et seq. and LHTF Program Guidelines;
6. The City Manager, or her designee, is authorized to execute the LHTF Program Application, the LHTF Standard Agreement and any subsequent amendments or modifications thereto, as well as any other documents which are related to the Program or the LHTF Award to Applicant, as the Department may deem appropriate; and,
7. The City Manager, or her designee, to issue a Letter(s) of Intent, as defined by the State, to Eligible Projects to provide funding if awarded by the State.

**Public Hearings** - The topic of the hearing is typically summarized by staff, followed by a presentation by the applicant, and questions from the City Council. The Mayor will then open the hearing to the public and offer an opportunity for public comments. Speakers are limited to a maximum of 3 minutes per person. To address the City Council in person, you must submit a speaker card to the City Clerk prior to the start of the presentation of the item.

**Other Agenda Items** are also open for public input including Consent Calendar or Matters for Consideration items. These comments are also subject to the 3-minute limit.

**Special Meetings, Workshops** - The public will have the opportunity to address the City Council regarding the item that is the subject of the special meeting or workshop. Public comments are limited to a maximum of 3 minutes per person.
