## MOTION TO APPROVE ACTIVITY & ATTENDANCE REPORT FOR FEBRUARY 2022 (BINNEY/OVITT) WAS CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

#### **DEPARTMENT REPORT:**

3. <u>Recreation & Community Services</u> – Nicholas Gonzalez, Recreation & Community Services Director, narrated a PowerPoint presentation on department highlights of program activities in February 2022.

#### **COMMENTS:**

**BINNEY:** Asked if AmeriCorps are visiting the elementary schools.

**GONZALEZ:** Stated the AmeriCorps Members are targeting children ages 6-12 years. We partner with the Ontario-Montclair School District to recruit this age group to come to our community centers and participate in our activities.

**BINNEY:** Asked if there are plans to re-seed the James R. Bryant Dog Park.

**GONZALEZ:** Responded that we will look into it and send him an update.

**CASKEY:** Asked if Westwind Community Center has a conversational Spanish Zoom class.

**GONZALEZ:** Our Conversational Spanish class is held out of the Ontario Senior Center, but you don't have to be a Senior to participate. Anyone can sign up for it.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

4. <u>Instructor Guide for Contract Class Programming</u> – Samantha Ochoa, Recreation & Community Services Coordinator, presented the department's updated Contract Instructor Guide. She reported that all of our current instructors had completed their contracts on time last week. We currently have 25 Contract Instructors, including those who teach on-site and offsite at their business locations. Ms. Ochoa reported that there are a lot of potential instructors who want to teach classes. We are working on creating a good balance and not being over-saturated with multiple classes on the same subject. Our goal is to maintain an excellent overall variety.

#### **COMMENTS:**

**NELSEN:** Asked Ms. Ochoa if she receives requests from instructors to teach at a specific location.

Ms. Ochoa responded that yes, it happens a lot, and sometimes, the space the instructor wants is being used by another instructor who has regular ongoing classes at that community center at the same time that the other instructor is requesting. Ms. Ochoa said she offers them any open locations we have, and they have up to 30 days to decide if that location will work for them.

Department's upcoming events.

**CASKEY:** Mr. Caskey stated that he always enjoys the employee highlights that Nick

Gonzalez includes in the monthly presentations. Mr. Caskey shared that Friday, March 18, 2022, Ontario Heritage held its 4th Annual Golf Tournament at Whispering Lakes Golf Course. It was a very successful event. He thanked Rita Nelsen for being instrumental in the planning and the Recreation Department for their support in providing tables and chairs. He also thanked Mayor pro Tem

Wapner and Council Member Debra Dorst-Porada for their support.

**NELSEN:** Shared that the Golf Tournament was great, and it was beautiful to see so many

participants. She stated that Mr. Caskey's energy at the event was a great representation of Ontario and its residents. Ms. Nelsen thanked Samantha Ochoa for her presentation and recognized that it was a difficult job, and she's doing great! 

2021 5K Reindeer Run & Rudolph's DASH Revenue Update

#### AGENDA REPORT SUMMARY

The Recreation & Community Services Department held its 10th Annual 5K Reindeer Run & Rudolph's DASH event on December 11, 2021.

In 2021, this event brought in record numbers, with a total of 3,228 runners and \$42,050 in sponsorship packages.

All proceeds from the race are donated to the Ontario-Montclair Promise Scholars, an award-winning program designed to assist Ontario-Montclair youth by helping to prepare them in their journey towards a college education; and the City's Empowerment Scholarship, which gives Ontario community members from

low-income backgrounds the opportunity to participate in recreation activities, classes, and programs that will enrich their lives.

Staff has completed the 2021 5K Financial/Participation Detail Report. The adjusted net proceeds for this event were \$91,076.21. The City of Ontario entered into an agreement with the Ontario-Montclair Schools Foundation to split the proceeds with 75% going to Ontario-Montclair Promise Scholars Program and 25% going to the City's Empowerment Scholarship Program.

Promise Scholars will receive \$68,3017.16 and the City will receive \$22,769.05.
