6a. Special Event Application from the Rotary Club of Quincy requesting permission to hold Oktoberfest on Saturday, September 26, 2026, between the hours of 3:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on York Street between 9th and 10th Streets. They request the closure of York Street, 9th to 10th Streets from 8:00 a.m. on Friday, September 25th through 12:00 p.m. (noon) on Monday, September 28th with barricades. There will be a large food tent and stage for live entertainment near the intersection of 9th and York Streets. Special Event Application requesting permission to hold the annual Quincy Senior High School Homecoming Parade on Thursday, September 10, 2026, beginning at 6:00 p.m. at 14th and Maine Street, proceeding east on Maine Street to Quincy Senior High School located at 33rd and Maine Street.
